

**18 Hole Ladies League - Far Corner Local Rules  
April 2023**

1	Ditch on left is penalty area (red stakes) entire hole Tee to Green
2	Out of bounds on left-trees marked and there are white stakes
3	Drainage ditch in front of tees is penalty area (yellow stakes) – <b>NOT</b> a free lift
4	Rear left of green (drainage area) <b>IS</b> a free lift
5	Out of bounds left of stone wall
6	French drain on left – relief to fairway (stance and 1 club length)
7	a. Penalty area (yellow stakes) in front of green b. Inlet in front of penalty area <b>IS</b> a free lift c. Left of walk-up path to green is penalty area (red stakes) d. Right side of hill (green side) is penalty area (red stakes) e. Ball in water penalty area twice – player can move to drop area in <b>rough</b> (past the green, near tree close to where carts parked)
9	If the red water pipes impede or inhibit your swing, you may drop the ball up to 2 club lengths laterally with no penalty.
10	Out of bounds on left - service road
11	Tree line on left & around back of green is penalty area (red stakes)
12	Out of bounds – on left of stone wall
13	Tree line on left is penalty area (red stakes) & inlet halfway down fairway
14	French drain (about 2-3 feet wide) on right <b>IS</b> a free lift
15	Drain (or casual water) in front of green <b>IS</b> a free lift
16	Tree line to green on left is penalty area (red stakes)
18	Out of bounds left

**Additional Statement**

- As an alternative to playing a provisional ball in the event of a lost ball or a ball out of bounds, the player can take a drop in the nearest spot of the fairway (within two club-lengths of the edge of the fairway), no nearer the hole than where the ball crossed the OB line, with a two-stroke penalty. The same local rule applies to a lost ball, with the player able to drop in the fairway across from where the previous ball is estimated to have come to rest. If a player chooses to play a provisional ball, then this alternative has been forfeited.
- These rules may be used in competition with other clubs.
- Play is governed by USGA rules.
